

---Many states have memory projects that include digitized newspapers. The majority of these newspapers are part of the aforementioned Chronicling America. However, it never hurts to compare search results between sites. Indiana's newspaper digitizing project is called Hoosier State Chronicles, with nearly 1.6 million newspaper pages from more than 186,000 issues at <u>newspapers.library.in.gov</u>.


